## 1847

About the same time Sr Stanislaus who for some time had a desire of being the third of the <u>reform</u> commenced the preparation that p[...] the departure from the community namely singularity and (a something) which was a word that the definition could or would not be given; however as Directors have to or are generally mentioned as a cloak to cover all disorder (that is in religious matters) all was important to him, but no one probably attempted to ascertain from him the reasons, no one in the Order knew so everyone was at liberty to pass on opinion on the subject.

We continued as usual to have mass in the Chapel once a month for renewal of the Sacred Species and also when a stranger passing through the city and whose Charity would induce to offer the holy sacrifice for [us.]

June 3

On the festival of Corpus Christi, three of the children made their first communion. Rev. Mr. Verot officiated on the following Sunday. They were confirmed by degrees it appeared that every thing was falling the school decreased sad was it to think on the future state of the community, or should have been so to every one but those who for so many years have experienced the persevering goodness of God those who are unworthy of it, but the Almighty, had yet something in reserve for us, another mark of the Providence of God of whom we are cho[...] /33/

## Oct. 11th

One of the father Redemptorists (Rev T. Anwander, whose zeal to promote the honour and Glory of God, and whose Charity led to the community to take its members as it were out of the dangerous state to which they appeared to be in, for they were without any fixed director and as strayed sheep since the departure of Rev. father Chakert and Smulders but new blessings were in reserve for them and no words can express the gratitude they have towards God and his worthy minister who spared no pains and delayed no time for on the Friday following feast of St Theresa he offered the holy sacrifice in the Chapel and has continued ever since, also to instruct the children the number at the time was about 20 and has increase to 60 or 70. Shortly, after Sister Catharine who was in very delicate health was ta[...] ill and on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> inst. was anointed for death, her pains increased and notwithstanding the care and attention of the Physician, it was visible that the heavenly Physician wished to call her to himself, she died on the 30<sup>th</sup> and was buried on the 31<sup>st</sup> at 3 o'clock. The funeral ceremony was performed by the Very Rev. L. R. Deluol D. assisted by Rev. Father Anwander.

## 5<sup>th</sup>

The sacrament of Baptism was conferred on Anna M. Bradford of Norfolk by Rev. F. T Anwander, she has taken at Baptism Mary Rose. The ceremony was performed before mass and during the holy sacrifice made her first communion. The Rev. Father gave an exhortation on the subject, she left on the same day to return home.

On the 8<sup>th</sup> of December festival of the Immaculate Conception, day appointed for the renewal of vows, the mass was at 6 o'clock said by Rev. L. R. Deluol in the evening our Rev. Director gave the Benediction of the B.S. On the 18<sup>th</sup> Margareth Jenkins was Baptised.

On Christmas Rev. Mr. Fredet offered the holy sacrifice in the Chapel /34/ about 5 o'clock and gave a short instruction on the occasion or rather on the Solemnity of the day. At the end of mass Henrietta Livers, for the first time received holy communion.
